Prohibited Item	Reason for confiscation
 Sharps (such as syringes and darts)	Can be used as a dangerous weapon to inflict significant injury to others/self
Liquids (any liquid which is not subject to a taste test, includes cleaning products, perfumes, lighter refills)	Violent assault, disfigurement
 Glass bottles	Can be used as a dangerous weapon to inflict significant injury to others/self
Protest materials (only the following: banners, posters, klaxons, loud hailers)	To reduce risk of protest in court/tribunal
Classic large umbrella (sturdy, long unfordable)	Can be used as a dangerous weapon to inflict significant injury to others
Motorcycle helmets	Can be used as a dangerous weapon/missile to inflict significant injury to others/self
Other (must only be confiscated on an exceptions basis, with clear justification from the C/TSO that the item is sufficiently suspicious and dangerous to warrant confiscation)	

Prohibited Item	Reason for confiscation
Knives (over 3" blade)	Illegal to carry in public
Knives or bladed articles (such as scissors and razors)	Can be used as a dangerous weapon to inflict significant injury to others/self
Metal cutlery (forks and knives, but not spoons)	Can be used as a dangerous weapon to inflict significant injury to others/self
Firearms	Can be used as a dangerous weapon to inflict significant injury to others/self
Other weapons (such as knuckle dusters, knitting needles and any form of explosive, including fireworks)	Can be used as a dangerous weapon to inflict significant injury to others/self
Tools (such as hammers, screwdrivers, multi-tools, cables, ropes, chains, chisel, spanners)	Can be used as a dangerous weapon to inflict significant injury to others/self
Alcohol	Can result in unruly behaviour/increase propensity for aggression/potential violence
Drugs (any drug without a prescription, which needs to be shown as proof)	Can result in unruly behaviour/increase propensity for aggression/potential violence

The above item has been taken into the custody of the court in accordance with section 54(1) - surrender/ section 54(2) - seizure* of the Courts Act 2003 on the grounds that the article:

- May jeopardise the maintenance of order in the court building*
- May put the safety of any person in the court building at risk*
- May be evidence of, or in relation to, an offence *

Any offensive weapons surrendered or seized will be automatically notified to the police, as will articles that may be evidence of, or in relation to, an offence. For this purpose, the weapon may be retained for a period not exceeding 24 hours from the time it was surrendered/ seized*

Should the surrendered article be one that may be returned to you, then upon leaving the court, you must contact a court security officer.

PLEASE NOTE THAT ANY ARTICLE LEFT IN THE CUSTODY OF THE COURT IS LEFT AT THE OWNERS RISK
